### KINDERGARTEN ADMISSION POLICY

Readiness for Kindergarten includes, but is not limited to, Preschool attendance, social skills, playtime with peers, the ability to make himself/herself clearly understood, understanding limits (i.e., "no" means "no"), an established routine of early bedtime and adequate sleep, independent toileting, the ability to write name and a few letters/numbers, and a familiarity with crayons, pencils, scissors, paints, PlayDoh, puzzles, Legos, and games.

To be eligible for Kindergarten, a child has to attain the age of five (5) years old on or before September 1, 2025. Siblings, Littlest Angels Preparatory Preschool Families, St. Paul's Parish Families, and out-of-parish families will be given order of preference when considering admissions into Kindergarten.

Applications will be accepted beginning October 1, 2024. Twenty-five (25) children are admitted to the Kindergarten class. Any remaining names will be added to the wait list.

If, in the determination of the Kindergarten Teacher, a child does not have the readiness skills necessary for Kindergarten based on observation, results of the Kindergarten Readiness Screening, and the Preschool Questionnaire, St. Paul's reserves the right to deny admittance.

#### **Requirements for Kindergarten**

- \*Appropriate age requirement
- \*A \$75.00 non-refundable Application Fee
- \*Current and Complete Immunization Record
- \*The original copies of the Birth and Baptism (if applicable) Certificates. These will be returned.
- \*Successful preschool experience (a full year is highly recommended)
- \*Preschool questionnaire completed by the child's current teacher and mailed by the teacher to: St. Paul's School, Attn: Admissions
- \*Successful completion/performance on the Kindergarten Readiness Screening
- \*Medical or Psycho-Educational Evaluation Reports for private or insurance subsidized testing, resulting in a diagnosis: any learning differences, ADHD, ADD, Dyslexia, Dysgraphia, etc.
- \*Any Medical diagnosis the school should be made aware of for safety reasons: Diabetes, Epilepsy, severe allergies requiring epi-pen or any condition requiring daily medication to be given at school.

#### **Kindergarten Readiness Screening**

The *Kindergarten Readiness Screening* for our fall 2025 class will be held on December 7, 2024 and January 11, 2025. We will continue to test until the waitlist is full. When the office has received a complete application packet, an appointment time will be scheduled for your child. This is an opportunity for the Kindergarten Teacher to observe and assess a child's cognitive, social, and fine motor skills. The screening for Kindergarten includes:

- \*A test of general knowledge, i.e., the teacher will ask developmentally appropriate questions.
- \*Observation of social interaction.

### **Notification of Acceptance**

Families will be notified of acceptance (or wait list) by email within two weeks of your child's testing date.

#### Dear Prospective Kindergarten Parent/Guardian:

Thank you for your interest in our school. We hope that you and your child are preparing for Kindergarten. Listed below are readiness skill questions that we would like you to review for your child, and with your child. Talk to him or her about some of these questions. Helping your child perform some of these tasks will ease the transition to an elementary school setting.

- 1. Can your child answer the following questions?
  - a. What is your name?
  - b. How old are you?
  - c. When is your birthday (month/day)?
  - d. Do you have any brothers or sisters?
- 2. Can your child dress himself/herself using buttons or zippers?
  - a. Can your child tie his/her shoes or is he or she learning to tie shoes?
- 3. Can your child tell the teacher when he or she needs to use the bathroom?
  - a. Can your child take care of bathroom needs on his or her own?
- 4. Can your child perform gross motor tasks?
  - a. Can your child walk up and down stairs with alternating feet?
  - b. Can your child skip or jump rope?
- 5. Can your child speak clearly and socialize well in a group setting?
  - a. Can your child make himself/herself understood when speaking?
  - b. Can your child follow one and two-step directions?
  - c. Can your child play nicely with other children?
  - d. Does your child use his or her words (not hands) to resolve conflicts with peers?
- 6. Do you read to your child daily?
  - a. Has your child spent time looking at picture books?
  - b. Has your child listened to stories and music?
  - c. Does your child watch Sesame Street or other educational programs on TV? Are there limits on screentime?

- 7. Has your child had experience with:
  - a. Using crayons, scissors, pencils, glue, clay, Playdoh, and paints?
  - b. Playing with puzzles, games, blocks, Legos?
- 8. Has your child had an opportunity to visit:
  - a. The zoo, the aquarium, the public library, and playgrounds?
  - b. The grocery store, the post office, and other businesses so he or she can learn to identify numbers, letters, colors, and shapes?
- 9. Does your child practice good health habits?
  - a. Does your child get 9-10 hours of sleep per night, and eat a well-balanced diet?
  - b. Does your child have good grooming habits (brush teeth, wash face, wash hands, etc.)?

#### **HISTORY OF ST. PAUL'S SCHOOL**

The history of St. Paul's School began with a dedication of the building on the corner of 29th and Church streets on June 30, 1916, by Archbishop Hanna. The school was staffed by fifteen Sisters of Charity of the Blessed Virgin Mary (BVMs), and at one time was the largest parochial school west of the Mississippi with over 1,000 students enrolled.

With the shifting patterns in both the Church and civic communities, St. Paul's School has become a smaller school with a more diverse student body. It maintains its high reputation and accommodates all pupils regardless of race, color, or creed. Because many families had both parents working outside the home, an Extended Day Care Program was started in the late 1970s.

The school continues to be embraced by the people of St. Paul's Parish, alumni, and parents. The faculty and staff profess their commitment to meeting the educational needs of students. The teachers work to find innovative methods in facilitating the learning process, both academic and spiritual. Many children currently enrolled are second- or third-generation students who continue the legacy of fine Catholic tradition and education.

Due to seismic retrofitting, the school was moved to an alternate site between the years 1994 and 1998, while the old building was demolished, and a new school was built. The St. Paul's community came together to make the best of a difficult situation during those years. It was with sheer delight that the students were moved back to a brand-new school in January 1999.

St. Paul's School has an excellent teaching staff. Their commitment to meeting the educational needs of our students is evidenced by their academic backgrounds, and their willingness to work for their students. Our teachers are always seeking the best way to motivate students and to facilitate the learning process. Because we believe that the family is key to the education of students, communication with parents is viewed as an important part of learning.

The school continues to stand proud and thrive as a symbol for all. St. Paul's School contains within it a sincere love of educating the mind, body, and soul in the time-honored Catholic tradition, which has been lovingly formed throughout the school's many years of service. The reputation of St. Paul's as an excellent Catholic school is a long and good one, of which we are very proud. In spring of 2016, we celebrated our 100th anniversary as a school dedicated to serving the needs of students in San Francisco's Noe Valley and throughout the Bay Area.

#### **Tuition**

Tuition for the 2024-2025 school year can be found in the Tuition and Fee Schedule included in this packet. Tuition and Fees will be revisited in Spring 2025 for the following school year. We offer a sibling discount. Some tuition assistance is available through Basic Fund, a privately funded foundation that provides tuition to families, as well as limited Archdiocesan Tuition Assistance, through TADS. Any student entering our Kindergarten program from Littlest Angel Preparatory Preschool will receive a 5% discount on his/her tuition for the kindergarten year only.

#### **Registration Fees**

Upon notification of acceptance, a non-refundable registration fee of \$675.00 will be required to secure your child's space in his/her respective grade.

#### FREOUENTLY ASKED OUESTIONS

#### What are the school hours?

Regular School Hours:

Kindergarten 8:00 a.m. – 2:30 p.m. Grades 1 to 4 8:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. Grades 5 to 8 8:00 a.m. – 3:15 p.m.

Younger siblings may attend Afternoon Extended Care (free of charge) until 3:00 p.m./3:15 p.m., while waiting for older sibling's dismissal.

Early Dismissal: Most Mondays, students in all grades are dismissed at 2:00 p.m. due to faculty meetings.

Minimum Days: The 4th Monday of each month is a 12:30 p.m. dismissal for faculty in-service and professional development. There are 10:00 a.m. dismissals on the first and last day of school, and 12:30 p.m. dismissal on Holy Thursday, and the day before Christmas vacation.

#### Is Extended Care available?

Yes, Extended Care is available! It is open each day school is in operation, except the first and last day of school and the day before Christmas vacation. It is open from Dismissal to 6:00 p.m. Fees vary according to how the program is used.

#### How many students are in each class?

Classes average 20 students—some are larger, and some are smaller. Classes are capped at 25 for Grades K-4 and 30 for Grades 5-8.

#### How old does a child need to be in order to be accepted into Kindergarten and Grade 1?

The child must be five years of age by September 1, 2025, for Kindergarten, and six years of age by September 1, 2025, for Grade 1.

#### Are the teachers certified?

All our teachers are credentialed; many of our teachers hold Masters' Degrees.

#### How much is tuition and how is it paid?

Tuition for the 2024-2025 school year is detailed in the attached Tuition and Extended Care Fee Schedule. There is a discount for siblings. Students entering Kindergarten from Littlest Angel Preparatory Preschool will receive a 5% discount on kindergarten tuition only. Families may choose from three different payment plans including a single payment, two-payment plan, or monthly (11-or 12-month) payment plans. If families choose either of the monthly plans, payments are made through the FACTS Tuition Management Company.

#### Is financial aid available?

Some tuition assistance is available through The Basic Fund, a privately funded foundation that provides tuition assistance to families, as well as limited assistance from the Archdiocesan Tuition Assistance program, through TADS. Additional aid may be available from the St. Paul's School Scholarship Fund to families who qualify for the Archdiocesan Tuition Assistance Program.

#### What is the service hour commitment?

A two-parent family is obligated to complete 40 service hours, and a single-parent family is obligated to complete 20 hours, in order to qualify for the Participating Family tuition rates.

#### How diverse is the school population?
